## **About OSA\* and OSA/CNSA\* Tournaments**

OSA tournaments are split into two events: Amateur (Amateur only) and Open (usually Experts, but anyone can play). For OSA and OSA/CNSA tournaments, please note: Try to register by 08:30 AM. - Cutoff time is 09:00 AM. Amateurs always start on the first day (usually a Tuesday) with Finals played the following day. The Open Experts start on the second day (usually Wednesday), with Finals played the last day. Tournament fee is \$10 each (2013). A Yearly OSA \$5 membership is required to play in any OSA tournament, and is good for the year.

Please commit yourself for a <u>full two days</u>. Most tournaments will have lunches available for purchase, but if not players should bring their own lunch and drinks for the day. Leaving a tournament location to purchase a lunch elsewhere could result in a forfeit and knock you (and your partner) out of a match if you are not present to go on court when called.

- \* OSA is the Ontario Shuffleboard Association. Anyone wishing to play in an OSA tournament must be a current-year OSA member.
- \* CNSA is the Canadian Shuffleboard Association. All participants must be a member of the CNSA. CNSA membership is included in OSA membership.
