All shufflers are welcome to play at OSA tournaments. They are FUN and you will meet great people. Amateurs have their own one-day tournament on Day 1. Open tournaments are played on Day 2 with the top eight teams coming back for “Finals” matches on Day 3. Both Amateurs and Experts can play in the Open tournaments.

An individual who has reached enough points to become an Expert, State Amateur, State Pro, or equivalent to any of these, at any point in their shuffleboard experience, regardless of where this status was obtained and when it takes effect, cannot play as an amateur in OSA sanctioned tournaments. Those earning enough points in Ontario to become an expert may remain in Amateur for the balance of the season.

You must be a member of the OSA (**\$10/year and available at the tournament**). All tournaments are “any doubles” meaning you must have a partner and none gender specific. Tournaments are **\$25/team per tournament** (ie amateur and open are two separate tournaments). Registration is 8:00am to 8:30am on the day of the tournament with play starting at 9:00. There is no guarantee your entry will be accepted after 8:30am. There will be a common lunch break around noon and play will end about 4:30pm on Days 1 and 2 (and about 2:00pm for those playing on Day 3).
